Before Hosting a Student

- Student should fully understand when and where the next gathering takes place
- Introduce student to American lifestyle and its social customs and manners
- Invite student to your daily activities such as going to school sporting event, church, family get-together
- Some students may not be used to pets; therefore, slowly introduce pets to them
- Introduce students to your family, community and friends
